Iâ€™ve had a can of Bar Keepers Friend under my kitchen cabinet for years. I used to use it to clean my former stainless steel sink. I never really took the time to read all of this miracle cleaners other uses. You can use it on porcelain, fiberglass, glass cooktops, copper, tile, and brass. It removes rust

and those pesky marks in your coffee cups.

Simply pour a few granules of Bar Keepers Friend on a damp cloth or directly on a wet surface and scrub off the stains.
