

## My Month on Instagram

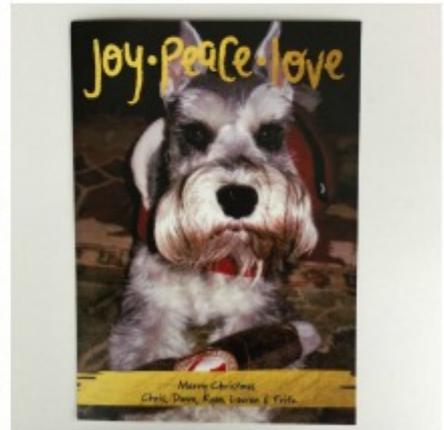
